

Estonian Safer Internet Centre



The main goals of the Estonian SIC project "Smartly on the Web" (*Targalt internetis*) are:

- children and young people smarter use of internet and digital communication devices;
- contributing to stamping out child sexual abuse from the Internet.

Working together with children and young people

Youth Panel with 15 young people from schools of different regions of Estonia.

The role of the Youth Panel:

- consulting the project team related to developing educational materials and organising events;
- contributing to the awareness raising events.

Face-to-face seminars 2-3 times per year; Facebook community for discussions.





- "Smartly on the web" training events in schools and kindergartens:
- Children
- Youngsters
- Parents
- Teachers

Main subjects:

privacy, protection of your information and yourself, communication online, cyber bullying, sexting, pornography online; useful websites, risks etc.

In 2011-2015 on behalf of 28 trainers and 3 web constables:

- •650 workshops in 334 schools and in 121 kindergartens have been carried out;
- •altogether **43 745** children and young people aged 6-16,
 - **4603** teachers/trainers and **2042** parents have got knowledge&information.


